F. Match Director Keith Tomes -Not present. -Written report read by Sheldon Latz as follows: A description of the "MAY FUN MATCH will be in the March newsletter. It promises to be a good time. This year the "Range and Field Training Team will be offering prizes at the "Fun Matches". Come and get your share. Subsequent matches will also be posted in the newsletter well in advance of the event. V. Old Business

A. Membership Renewal -President David Lombardo stressed that dues must be in by March 31st or they will no longer be a member. -Our insurance will not cover anyone that does not meet the requirements.

B. Zoning Board -There has been some miscommunication with the zoning board. The president received a letter stating the need to contact them within 10 days. President Lombardo requested Steve Bashaw to represent the interest of the club. The question of the Center Fire Rifle Range was presented to the county. Steve was informed that Clyde Howell does not want one on his property; therefore this will not be pursued. A special use permit will be requested to bring all of our activities into conformance with the Zoning Classification. There will be some cost and time involved. -At this time, Keith LeDez questioned the use of 0.17 caliber use at the range. After a short discussion, it was determined that they could be used on paper targets and not on 22 steel targets. -A question came up on the use of the range by guests. President Lombardi said the guests first visit was for nothing. However, all users of the range must sign in at the silo so they are covered by insurance. Any guest using the ranges thereafter must pay the \$5.00 fee.

C. Kendall County Fair-July29-August 1, 2004 -Volunteers are needed to cover the Air Gun booth.

D. Trap House renovation -A short discussion was held and a couple of members will look at the trap house to determine what needs to be done and will bring it back for discussion.

E. Pistol League -Dave McKinney

explained the point system he will follow for scoring and requested volunteers to help him. This will start in May. Shotgun League -Ed McGunn will start in May and needs volunteers. He will come early to help teach the basics of shot gunning. Rifle League -Keith LeDez will consider running the Rifle League IDPA -Dave McKinney needs volunteers to run event. F. Outdoor Women Program -So far no one on the board is interested in working in this activity. President Lombardo said someone needs to organize the program, He does not have time to do this. There are some volunteers but no organizer thus far.

G. Family Fun Shoot -Many thoughts but no work has been done on this because of no help. The club should pay for the family member but not for guests. No one wants to coordinate the program, therefore this activity may fall by the wayside.

VII. Good and Welfare President Lombardo said he has reached a crossroad with being President and Camp Coordinator. He explained his employment is becoming more demanding and the amount of work and time that operating of the club demands is making it difficult to do the job. In addition, he explained that he was being haggled by other club members as to what he was doing and, at this time, he feels he has had enough of this dissention. He discussed that he will resign within two (2) weeks. This will give him a chance to get loose ends tied

up. A very lengthy discussion followed on various issues that have taken place in the past. All members present took part in the discussion. Debbie Ritchie and Bob Gosp said if David resigns, they will also resign. The members convinced David to stay on until next meeting when the issues could be discussed again. He agreed to hold his resignation. Another issue that was discussed was regarding club members that do not comply with the rules, such as not having a current NRA and FOID card on file. It was the consensus that they are no longer valid members of Howell Shooting Club. If they do not meet the criteria, they will be out of the club.

Letter to the Editor:

Bob:

Attached is the "legal notice" referred to in David's email. Actually, it is a "Petition for Impeachment or Removal of a Member of the Board of Directors" which I prepared according to the Constitution and Bylaws at the request of a number of the members present at the March 2004 general meeting. I have forwarded the draft of the petition to Andrew Romig and Deb Richey. It is important to note that there are three procedural steps that must be followed: (1) The Petition may be initiated by "any member" and signed by no fewer than 25% of the Club's active members, (2) the Petition must be presented to a non-party member of the board of directors for review to determine that it complies with the Constitution and Bylaws, and (3) The "Issue" must be published in the newsletter in order for a hearing to be held at the next General Meeting. While I have great concerns that this is a very serious and difficult step to be taken in the Club, I have even greater concerns that the conflict that was aired at the March meeting be resolved in a manner which provides a fair hearing and due process to the accused on the issue and that it be done quickly so that this does not remain an impediment for action

going forward on the Youth Camp. I, for one and a new member of the Club who has volunteered to help provide the Camp's food service, am not willing to proceed while all of this conflict is going on within the Board and I am uncertain of the support of the members. For that reason alone, I believe that the issue must come to a focus at the next meeting and that the Club must get through and over the problems presented at the last meeting. I have not formulated an opinion on the facts or allegations thus far. I spoke with Lou Tomes at length yesterday and discovered that there are, as always, "two sides to the story". I hope that other members are keeping an open mind as well, but do think it impairative that this matter be resolved at a general membership meeting and as quickly as possible.

The Best Kept Howell Club Secret

Our first club fun match is coming up on Sunday, May 2nd, following the General Meeting. That may seem like a long way off, and maybe it is for those of you who don't need to practice, but the rest of us mere mortals may wish to get in a little quality time on the range before then. Here's what we'll be shooting; it's called an 'El Presidente'. Now to me that's a cigar but John Millington assures me that not only is it a pistol match, it is an historic match which had its start in Mexico. Originally the match called for the shooter to begin with his back to the targets with his pistol holstered. He would turn, draw and fire two shots at each of three targets. Not to be outdone, the Americans added a reload and six more shots. Since we are Americans and to help celebrate 'Dos de Mayo', we'll be shooting the American version and holsters will be required. (Per club rules, no cross draw holsters will be allowed.) Revolvers, semi-autos, rimfire and center fire with any sights are welcome. Due to the reload, a speed-loader or second magazine would be helpful but are not required. John will be making some of his personal holsters available for use. They may or may not fit your pistol. Even if one does, this means that you will have had no time to practice with it. John will also very generously make a .357 revolver, speed-loader and appropriate holster available. You will need to provide the ammunition and if you are using any of John's holsters, you will need to provide a belt. Suspenders won't cut it. Using an equation that only

he knows, John will determine a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winner based on speed, accuracy, dress, deportment and bribery. **Prizes Will Be Awarded!!!** Among others, there will be a certificate from The Range and Field Training Team toward any of the NRA courses they offer. There is no age requirement but safe firearm handling and use rules will be strictly adhered to.

I have shot with and competed against John for years. He is an enthusiastic and competent instructor with a great deal of experience. To those willing to listen instead of talking at the line, he is a wealth of useful information. I would strongly encourage you to bring your kids along. If needs be, we'll add a Junior Division just for them. Don't let the word 'Match' keep you away or intimidate you. These matches are **FUN!** If your skills are as marginal as mine, this is a great opportunity to learn and gain experience in a friendly atmosphere. Our club now has over 100 members. We all share a love of the sport and each of us brings something unique to it. Come out and share your knowledge, share the comraderie and meet some of the members of your 'extended family'. There just may be a shooter there who needs your specific piece of advice or vice versa. You can't beat the price either,... **It's Free!** If you can't be there for the General Meeting, just come out at about 10:30ish and you'll be right on time. You need to clean your pistols once a year anyway so why not have some fun for the effort? So come out on May 2nd and see what this 'Best Kept Secret' is all about. If you don't have a **Great** time,... you don't have to do it again,... but you **will** be back. As John would say, your preparation period begins now. Make this the year that you attend all five club, fun matches. Besides,... if you're not there,... we'll talk about ya.

From the desk of the Chief Firearms Instructor:

Based on a comment in an article from the January newsletter, the question was asked if the NRA courses taught were being disassociated from the Howell

Shooting Club. The answer is, 'No, the NRA firearm courses are still very much a part of HSC'. In fact, the number of courses scheduled for 2004 are more than double those taught in 2003. This year there will be nineteen courses taught with the addition of three new course offerings, 'Home Firearm Safety', 'Range Safety Officer' and 'Reloading'. To accomplish this ambitious schedule, several courses have been moved to locations other than HSC. This provides several benefits: it promotes HSC to a wider area than Church Road and increases HSC name recognition with other clubs and the shooting community as a whole. Other facilities also offer additional amenities such as kitchen facilities, indoor plumbing and larger classrooms which are all beneficial for both the classes and the students. Teaching off premises did necessitate two things, #1 Providing private insurance to cover offsite courses and #2 The formation of a training team to help accomplish the expanded schedule. The rate of financial compensation to HSC was proposed by the club President at the December, education meeting. The HSC Board of Directors voted on and approved the proposed compensation at their next board meeting in January. Each of the training team members provides their own insurance which matches the Club's policy. The training team also provides all course materials and training aids in addition to promoting and conducting the courses. The HSC reaps the benefits of having the Club name attached to courses taught offsite and the financial compensation it requested and approved. The HSC will no longer be responsible for course expenses as it was in the past. It is hoped that this has helped to eliminate any confusion.

The HSC EMS CPR and AED Course

Well, Bob and Susan Goepp have given their first American Heart Association First Aid and CPR course at HSC. It is their intent to get as many club members, camp workers and instructors certified in First Aid and CPR as possible. Several of our club NRA instructors took this first course so they will

be bringing these additional certifications to the courses they teach. This is just one of many ways that Bob and Susan will be helping HSC to host a successful and safe Youth Camp this year. This course is for anyone who comes in contact with people,... in other words, all of us. Would you know what to do if your spouse or a parent had a heart attack or a stroke in your presence? What if one of your grandchildren were to choke on a piece of candy? Can you tell the difference between the bite marks of a venomous and non-venomous snake? Can you take nitroglycerine with your Viagra? Bob and Susan are self-proclaimed 'EMS junkies' and it shows. They are both paramedics and bring to their courses years of experience in emergency medicine as well as time spent in the military and as a firefighter. They have the knowledge, skills and experience to not only teach the course but to 'spice it up' a little with their own experiences from the field as to what they've seen, what works and what doesn't. They are **very good** at what they do and their enthusiasm is contagious. You leave the class **almost** hoping that you'll come across some disaster on your way home just so you can put some of their training to use. As a husband and wife team they can trade off with each other for the instruction, reinforce each other's training while it is going on and they compliment each other well which all adds up to an enjoyable course for their students. The hours just seemed **fly** by. Among other things we learned that 'EMS CPR and AED' stand for emergency medical services, cardio-pulmonary resuscitation and automatic external defibrillator. Students receive a First Aid textbook, their CPR card and a 'CPR shield' to use if you are ever called upon to perform CPR. And if all this isn't enough to get you to sign up for their next course, they brought munchies and coffee for the students. The entire course is taught indoors so the weather is not a consideration. If you were unable to attend this course, Bob and Susan are willing to put on others if there is enough interest. Press Release from The Illinois State Rifle Association

YOUR ASSISTANCE URGENTLY NEEDED We have learned that Blagojevich and Daley are teaming up to institute a new gun owner registration database here in Illinois. This move by Blagovich & Daley is intended to circumvent a federal law that requires law enforcement agencies to destroy gun purchase records within 24 hours. If this Blago-Daley gun grab law passes, then you and all your guns will be registered in a government computer that can be accessed by anyone who wants to. Thus, your gun inventory, your name, address, and phone number will be available to government agents, reporters, crooks and antigunners. There is no bill number yet for this assault on your freedoms and privacy. As soon as we get the bill number we will let you know. We

suspect that the bill will be introduced in the House. In the mean time, here is what you must do to save your guns... 1.

Contact your own State Representative and NICELY ask him or her to oppose any bill that establishes a gun owner database. If you do not know who your State Representative is, then go to this link: <http://www.legis.state.il.us/> and then click on the link in the lower right that says "Legislator Lookup." 2. Attend the ISRA Lobby Day Rally at the State Capitol on Wednesday, March 24th. The rally kicks off at 8:00 AM in the Stratton Building Cafeteria. The Stratton Building is located across the street from the Capitol. After the rally, we will ask you to go visit your legislator to remind him or her that you do not want either you or your guns registered in a government computer. GUN OWNERS PREPARE TO DO BATTLE THIS WEEK

The week of March 22nd may very well see the "mother of all battles" waged in the Illinois General Assembly over gun control. As reported in an earlier alert, we believe that Governor Blagojevich will have his people in the Illinois House try to sneak a gun licensing and registration bill through this week as a floor amendment to an existing bill. If this bill passes, it will result in an internet database of all your guns. How does that sound?

Our Bill of Rights does not **grant** rights, it **preserves** and **guarantees** pre-existing **individual** rights. How do we know this? The Ninth Amendment states:

"The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people."

In other words, we have other rights beyond what is expressly stated in the Constitution, and the federal government is not justified in denying us those rights.

What could those rights be? Although, this Web site is not for the purpose of discussing natural and positive rights, below are quotes from two Founding Fathers telling us that

the right to self-defense is a natural right, it cannot be justifiably taken away by any governing body.

"I go farther; and now proceed to show, that in peculiar instances, in which those rights can receive neither protection nor reparation from civil government, they are, notwithstanding its institution, entitled still to that defence, and to those methods of recovery, which are justified and demanded in a state of nature."

"The defence of one's self, justly called the primary law of nature, is not, nor can it be abrogated by any regulation of municipal law."

--- James Wilson, Wilson, *Of the Natural Rights of Individuals*, in 2 The Works of James Wilson 335 (J.D. Andrews ed. 1896).

The above quote is from a series of lectures given between 1790 and 1792.
